Kamran Haghghat, B.D.S., M.S.



Dr. Haghghat received his dental degree from the University of Newcastle-Upon-Tyne in England in 1993. After a three-year hospital Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery residency and three years in General Private Practice, he began a three-year program at Ohio State University where he received a certificate in Periodontology and a Masters Degree. His research focused on new grafting materials for bone regeneration procedures. After completing his work at OSU, Dr. Haghghat took a position as Assistant Professor and Director of Pre-Doctoral Periodontology at Oregon Health and Sciences University where he taught at the Pre-Doctoral and Post-Doctoral levels for four years. He is currently in full-time private practice in Tigard, Oregon. His practice offers the full scope of surgical and non-surgical periodontal treatment with an emphasis on periodontal plastic and esthetic surgery, hard and soft tissue augmentation procedures, as well as over ten years of experience in oral implantology. He continues to collaborate in research involving implants and bone grafting materials, and contributes to the literature in the field through published articles and textbooks. Dr. Haghghat is a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology and belongs to numerous professional organizations.

THE PROGRAM

More patients than ever before are choosing dental implants as an option for tooth replacement. The increasing utilization of dental implants has come about by growing public awareness of the benefits of dental implants over conventional tooth replacement, and by the development of user-friendly implant procedures. Newer bone augmentation techniques increase the number of potential sites for implant placement, which will in turn increase the number of implant patients in any dental office, from the surgical, through the restorative, to maintenance phases of therapy. Patient-friendly implant protocols reduce the number of office visits and the time from tooth removal to implant restoration and function.

In this course, Dr. Haghghat will highlight the pivotal role of the dental hygienist in implant therapy and discuss the implementation of a customized maintenance regimen for the long-term success of implant restorations. Current concepts in bone augmentation techniques and future perspectives which hold the promise of increasing the opportunities for implant placement in our patients will be explained, so that all dental professionals can identify implant candidates and explain treatment to patients. A better understanding of these concepts will enhance treatment planning and case acceptance in dental offices. Dr. Haghghat will also discuss appropriate case selection for immediate implant placement at the time of tooth removal, and when immediate provisional restorations and/or immediate functional loading may be used.

- The failing implant: when to treat and when to remove
- The indications and contraindications for immediate implant placement and/or loading
- Techniques available for fabrication of immediate prostheses and immediate loading
- Current concepts for implant site preparation using various graft materials
- Future perspectives including growth factor enhancement of graft materials and the potential for stem cell technology
